Mangroves: SPREP is facilitating the first regional workshop on mangrove monitoring in Fiji from November 8th-12th, 2010 and has signed an agreement with IUCN under the

Pacific Mangrove Initiative which aims at fostering collaboration between different regional partners such as USP, WorldFish Center, SPREP and IUCN. SPREP has also collaborated with member countries to formulate the new Regional Mangrove Action Plan for 2011-2013.

Turtles: SPREP facilitated the following projects and activities:

- sub regional satellite tagging training in Fiji;
- Community-based turtle monitor project under the CEPF funds.
- Regional review of turtle legislation
- Dugong surveys with the secretariat of the Convention on Marine Species in PNG, Solomon Islands, Vanuatu, New Caledonia and Palau (For more information, contact Lui Bell: luib@sprep.org)

Coral Reefs: SPREP is completing its component of the CRISP programme with the following products to be delivered in the next few weeks:

- Business plan for the Moorea MPA network, French Polynesia (Earth Collective)
- Economic valuation of various integrated coastal management approaches in the Pacific region (IUCN Oceania)
- Tool for communities to assess their supplementary livelihood options (Foundation of the People of the South Pacific International)
- Governance framework for the Solomon Islands to assist community-based management
- Review of Community Marine Managed Area Monitoring and development of a participatory monitoring protocol.

Under the Taiwan-Republic of China fund, SPREP is finalizing an economic valuation of the use of destructive fishing practices in Kiribati along with policy recommendations to improve legislation on these practices.
