a. Please provide any lessons you have learned from your experiences of developing partnerships with the private sector that might be relevant to ICRI members?

The Green Fins programme was initiated few years ago in COBSEA region. Its mission is to protect and conserve coral reefs in South East Asian Seas by establishing and implementing environmentally friendly code of conduct and guidelines for dive operators, diving clubs divers and snorkelers. Green Fins members are also involved raising conservation awareness, in basic coral reef monitoring, underwater reef cleanups operations and adopt-a-reef programme. The involvement of Green Fins has also been introduced into the private sector by the participation of members of private companies and by the promotion of eco-tourism.

The programme is developing fast in Thailand through the hard work of a local NGO and it is COBSEA's intention to enlarge the geographic scope of the programme to neighbouring countries like Malaysia, Indonesia and Philippines.

- c. Are there any monitoring or research activities you are either involved in or aware of aimed at improving understanding of adaptive management of coral reefs and related ecosystems that may be of interest to ICRI members?

A regional level workshop on marine litter and cleanup campaign organized in September 2008 in Pattaya, Thailand was participated by nearly 1000 people. It also entailed a Green Fins meeting of network leaders of participating countries to strengthen and harmonize its implementation, a Green Fins Photo Contest, national clean beach awards, photo exhibition and marine litter art exhibition. Besides beach cleanup there was also underwater cleanup involving the active participation of Green fins members.

A Green Fins online database on coral reefs status of the data collected by its members has been established in Thailand. There has also been the establishment of a Green Fins web-page and online assessment system of members of the Green Fins network.

It is the intention of the Green Fins Programme (both in Thailand and in other countries of the region) to further develop the monitoring component of the programme.

Although the monitoring component of the Green Fins programme is not conducted by 'pure scientists', the fact that hundreds of thousands of sport and recreation divers can contribute to the knowledge and the assessment of the state of coral reefs is an asset upon which reasonably good qualitative and quantitative data can be generated.

Examples could include any efforts through workshops, environmental education programs, beach and underwater clean ups, etc. with coastal/local communities to promote understanding and recognition of the environmental services coral reefs provide.

Various outreach, education, training, development of the code of conduct for responsible diving, assessments of diving operators, cleanup campaigns, etc. were carried out by Geen Fins with UNEP/COBSEA's support.
