- Promoted IYOR among Wider Caribbean Governments at Intergovernmental and Contracting Parties Meeting of Caribbean Regional Seas Programme. Decisions were adopted at those meetings in December 2006 welcoming IYOR and requesting organisations and countries to participate. Those Decisions were forwarded to ICRI Forum.
- 2) For Biodiversity Day in May, we have selected reefs and IYOR as one of the themes together with dolphins (since 2007 is Year of the Dolphin). We also plan to capitalise on the attention that climate change is receiving to link reefs into the equation.
- 3) Fundraising to support a regional managers & scientists event in 2007 to promote, plan and provide inputs for IYOR (possibly in conjunction with GCFI in Dominican Republic in November 2007).

- Key activities of the member since last report relating to coral reefs and associated ecosystems
- Launching on 12-13 April 2007 of GEF/UNEP-CEP Project to Reduce Pesticide Runoff to the Caribbean Sea (Colombia, Costa Rica and Nicaragua) (US \$10 million total with US\$ 5million from GEF).
 - Identify points of relevance to other ICRI members, or the secretariat (eg points of particular concern; questions to ask of ICRI; information requested; assistance sought; lessons learned
 - We need more guidance and would like cohesiveness for IYOR activities, while each region and country should develop their own activities, a general strategy and common threads will be useful to have more impact. The issues of overfishing, climate change and pollution (sediments and sewage) and private sector and government roles should be common threads to highlight during IYOR.
- Better and more strategic linkages between ICRI and FAO and fisheries commissions are needed (at least for the Wider Caribbean) and their active participation in IYOR should be sought.
 - Identify forthcoming activities that might be of interest to other members in terms of funding; partnership; uptake.
- Preparation of the GEF/UNDP/UNESCO-IOC Caribbean large marine ecosystem (CLME) Project, which includes one full component reef fisheries and biodiversity to be completed during 2007. Major objective is to strengthen management and policy interventions in countries of the region. UNEP-CAR/RCU is member of Steering Committee.
