

#### 14th International Coral Reef Symposium VIRTUAL, July 2021:

- First ONLINE ICRS due to pandemic restrictions
- 1400 participants from more than 80 countries



- First ICRS organized by a European institution
- 700 oral and 400 poster presentations organised in 15 overarching themes









## ICRS Delegation to UNFCCC COP26, Glasgow, UK:

- 8 ICRS members attended COP26 over two weeks
- ICRS Flyer based on the Science to Policy paper
- ICRS-led side event in the EU
   Pavilion: 'Climate change mitigation and adaptation through coastal ecosystems conservation and restoration'















## ICRS Delegation to UNFCCC COP26 (continued):

- Contributed to other side events e.g.
   'Corals and climate change; addressing threats through global, national, and local approaches' (Commonwealth Secretariat and the UK Presidency)
- Met with delegates from over 30 countries as well as key international and regional organisations
- ICRS Booth on the Virtual Ocean Platform (Global Ocean Forum)







#### 15<sup>th</sup> International Coral Reef Symposium, Bremen, July 2022:

- 1200 participants from more than 80 different countries
- 400 additional online participants via the virtual conference platform/app
- 800 oral and 300 poster presentations in 100 sessions
- Science to Policy Session: Coral Reefs and Climate
- 30% of all presentations by students











## 15<sup>th</sup> ICRS, Bremen, July 2022 (continued):

- First climate-neutral ICRS
- Largest marine science conference ever held in Germany
- More than 50 % of plenary speakers and chairs were female
- Free attendance for online participants from developing countries













## ICRS Delegation to UNFCCC COP27, Sharm el-Sheik, Eqypt:

- Three ICRS members over two weeks
- Met with delegates from coral reef countries and key international organisations
- Participated in workshops with GFCR and CORDAP
- Presentations on science-based solutions for minimizing coral reef decline












### Accomplishments in 2022 - 2023



## **UNFCCC – RINGO / Ocean Climate Dialogue**

- Active member of UNFCCC's RINGO Groups (Research and Independent Non-Government Organisations)
- Contributed to the 2023 Ocean and Climate Change Dialogue in Bonn (June)
- Submitted points for discussion at the Dialogue in relation to coral reefs and nature-based solutions







## Ongoing 2023 Activities



#### ICRS Delegation to UNFCCC COP28, Dubai, 2023

- Ongoing side event applications for multiple pavilions with CORDAP, Coral Restoration Consortium, The Commonwealth Secretariat and others
- Focus on action and implementation of tools to improve / restore coral reefs
- Reduced number of delegates from observer organisations

# Mentorship and Belonging Chapter



- Mentorship Program September 2023
- Broad Goals:
  - Facilitate mentorship pairs between ICRS members
  - Encourage multidimensional mentorship all aspects of life
  - Conduit for global partnerships that cross different career stages and institutions
  - Promote a sense of **belonging** for people who are under-represented
- 40 mentors from 12 countries
- 54 Mentees from 20 countries



# Equality, Diversity and Inclusion Committee



- Sliding scale for membership fees based on Country Economic Status to encourage membership from the Global South, especially SIDS
- Free virtual attendance to ICRS Symposia for participants from developing countries
- Developing proposal for supporting the well-being of ICRS members in response to the coral reef crisis (Caribbean) e.g. sponsoring online workshops
