





# Celebrating 30 Year's #ForCoral

- Founded in 1994 by 8 nations: Australia, France, Japan, Jamaica, the Philippines, Sweden, United Kingdom, and the United States of America.
- ICRI was announced at the first Conference of the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD), on December 7th 1994.

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- Since 1994, ICRI has been chaired and co-chaired by 14 countries, with a total of 13 different secretariats from around the world.

## ICRI Call to Action

- The first "ICRI Call to Action" was approved at the ICRI Workshop held in Dumaguete City, The Philippines (on June 2, 1995) and is supported by the "ICRI Framework for Action" to mobilise governments and the wide range of other stakeholders to implement the Call to Action.
- In 1998, ICRI adopted a Renewed Call to Action, and in 2013 a renewed Framework for Action

# The Global Coral Reef Monitoring Network

- The GCRMN was established by ICRI in 1995, as an operational network, to monitor the condition of the world's coral reefs.
- GCRMN has three primary goals with capacity building as a fourth, overarching priority.:

Goal 1. Improve understanding of coral reef status and trends, globally and regionally

Goal 2. Analyse and communicate coral reef biophysical, social and economic trends, providing science-based recommendations in support of raising awareness, management and policy development

Goal 3. Enable and facilitate greater utilization of coral reef data, including in research

Goal 4. Build human and technical capacity to collect, analyse and report biophysical and socio-economic data on coral reefs.











# International Marine Ecosystems Management Symposiums

Since 1998, ICRI has held 5 International Marine Ecosystems Management Symposiums (ITMEMS)














# GCRMN: Status of Coral Reefs of the World Reports

• Since 1998, ICRI has released 6 Coral Reefs of the World Reports















## GCRMN: **Topical Reports**































# Contribution to Environmental Processes


